		And when they shall say unto you:
	(and)	"Seek unto them that have familiar spirits (mediums), (Seek) unto wizards that peep (huddle together), and that mutter."
		(Because the Lord has sealed up the revelations and prophets are not prophesying for a time there will be those who resort to mediums or spiritualists, séances etc. to gain information. Isaiah says in those times he will wait on the Lord and remember that he and his children bear prophecies from the Lord in their very names.)
