Verse 1		Thus saith the Lord:

Verse 5 Hear the word of the Lord, ye that tremble at his word: Your brethren that hated you, Your brethren that cast you out for my name's sake. Said: "Let the Lord be glorified," (but) "He shall appear to your joy." (Let the Lord manifest his glory, that we may see cause for your joy!) (and) They shall be ashamed (suffer shame). (This statement suggests division within Israel itself, wherein the wicked cast out the righteous (51:7). The verb in Hebrew means "to excommunicate" but also suggests "to cast down" or "to reject," ... These are errant Israelites mocking their believing brethren. UI Pg. 585 - Professor Gileadi concurs - Asking for a sign in effect.) Verse 6 (Hark,) a voice of noise from the city, a voice from the temple! (It is the) voice of the Lord that rendereth recompence to his enemies. Verse 7 A Before she travailed (was in labor), B She brought forth (gave birth). (Zion's children - Birth) A Before her pain came, B She delivered of a man child. Verse 8 C Who hath heard such a thing? C Who hath seen such things? (Zion's children – Birth) D Shall the earth be made to bring forth (labor) in one day? D Shall a nation be born at once? (or) A For as soon as Zion travailed, B She brought forth her children.

Verse 9		D "Shall I bring to the birth and not cause to bring forth?" saith the Lord.
(Zion's children – Birth)		D "Shall I cause to bring forth, and shut the womb? " saith thy God.
		(Called, "The Birth Pangs of the Messiah" in Judaism – Matt. 24:4-8 – Deliverers to the Woman/Israel – Moses, David, Hezekiah, Jesus – Everything will happen very quickly, spiritual and political change, after the birth/coming of the son, then the other children of Zion – There are some who don't want this to occur, even among the righteous, but the Lord will not delay or stop the coming of Zion – Per Prof. Gileadi.)

Verse 17		They (the cultists) that sanctify themselves and they (the devotees of those) that purify themselves (through fornication) in gardens (with one in the center):
	(and) (and)	Eating swine's flesh, Eating the abomination (prawn), Eating the mouse,
		Shall be consumed together, saith the Lord.
Verse 18	(For) (and)	I know their works, I know their thoughts.
		(The cultists shall be consumed together along with their practices and ideas – Per Prof. Gileadi's translation – manifestation of their wickedness as full)

Verse 19	(And)	I will set a sign among (mark upon) them and I will send those that escape of them unto the nations:
		(The "mark" being a seal of protection from wickedness/the elements while they gather the rest of the people who may inhabit Zion – See Rev. 7:3, 9:4, 20:4, 22:4, D&C 77:9; 133:18 - Prof. Gileadi)
	(and)	to Tarshish, to Pul, to Lud (those that draw the bow), to Tubal, to Javan,
	(and)	to The Isles Afar Off,

(The place names were the extent of the known earth in ancient times, symbolizing the truth that the Lord will reach unto the ends of the earth. Tarshish may have been Spain, Pul and Lud are both probably in northern Africa, Tubal is probably in Asia Minor near the Black Sea and Javan is Greece. UI Pg. 592)
I will send those that have not heard of my fame, I will send those that have not seen my glory.

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	(and)	They shall declare my glory among the Gentiles (the nations).
Verse 20	(And)	They shall bring all your brethren, for an offering unto the Lord, out of all nations:
	(and) (and) (and) (and)	upon horses, upon chariots, in litters (in wagons), upon mules, upon swift beasts (dromedaries - one humped, fast camels),
		To my Holy Mountain, Jerusalem.
		(Just as the Israelites brought offerings in pure vessels to the House of the Lord,)
Verse 21	(And) (and)	I will also take of them (accept men of them) for priests, I will also take of them for Levites, saith the Lord.
Verse 22	(For)	As the new heavens and the new earth, which I will make, shall remain (endure) before me, saith the Lord, So shall your seed and your name remain (endure) (before me). (See Mosiah 5:10-11 - The Name of Christ)
Verse 23	(And)	It shall come to pass that:
	(and)	From one New Moon to another, (New Moon after New Moon) From one Sabbath to another. (Sabbath after Sabbath)
		All flesh shall come to worship before me, saith the Lord.
Verse 24	(And)	They shall go forth and shall look upon the carcases of the men that have transgressed against me:
	(For)	Their worm shall not die, Their fire shall not be quenched. (like trash smoldering)
	(and)	They shall be an abhorring (a horror) unto all flesh.

(In the last of the last days, those who are slain by war and pestilence will be so numerous that they cannot be buried (Jer. 7:30-8:2). Jeremiah 7:32 refers to one location that will be called "the valley of slaughter; for they shall bury [there], till there be no place" (See also Ezek. 39:11-15). Those who go out in to the land will see the dead bodies of those slain in the destruction of the wicked (Jer. 7:32-33). Motyer argues that inhabitants of Zion will deliberately "compel themselves to face the consequences of the last battle." They do so "to be repelled. To see and constantly refresh the memory that these are the consequences of rebellion, and so to turn in revulsion from such a thing and to be newly motivated to obedience by seeing that the wages of sin are indeed death." UI Pg. 594 – "Valley of Gehenna" - "Hamon Gog" - Valley of Slaughter - Valley of The Son of Hinnom (where child sacrifices occurred) – Called "The Pit of Hell" – Topheth/Tophet, "Place of Burning", "Place of the Tabret" Once the king's gardens with music and later the place of horrible cries from the sacrifice of victims.)
